## MEMORANDA OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN SINGAPORE AND REPUBLIC OF KOREA TO FOSTER GREATER ECONOMIC COLLABORATION

- 1. Singapore's Ministry of Trade and Industry and the Republic of Korea's Ministry of Trade, Industry and Energy exchanged three Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) today to promote greater economic collaboration in the areas of trade, industry and energy. The MOUs were exchanged by Senior Parliamentary Secretary for Trade and Industry and Foreign Affairs Dr Tan Wu Meng and Republic of Korea Minister for Trade Kim Hyun-chong, in the presence of Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong and Republic of Korea President Moon Jae-in.
- 2. Under the MOU on trade, both sides will launch a Korea-Singapore Free Trade Agreement (KSFTA) implementation review. This MOU also reaffirms mutual commitment by both countries towards strengthening the ASEAN-Korea FTA, as well as working towards a substantive conclusion of the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) negotiations by 2018. The MOU on industry focuses on cooperation in Fourth Industrial Revolution technologies and aims to enhance cooperation in Medical/Bio Technology, Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Industrial Internet of Things (IIoT). The MOU on energy will allow both countries to pursue mutual cooperation in smart grids, as well as energy security and Internet of Things (IoT) applications in energy technologies.
- 3. Dr Tan said, "Singapore and the Republic of Korea enjoy good bilateral economic relations and today's MOUs will further deepen our economic ties. I am particularly happy to note that both countries have agreed to launch a KSFTA implementation review under the MOU on free and open trade. The KSFTA is an important cornerstone of our bilateral economic relations and this review will ensure that the agreement continues to remain relevant to the business needs of both Singaporean and Korean companies."
- 4. In 2017, the Republic of Korea was Singapore's 9<sup>th</sup> largest trading partner, with bilateral trade in goods amounting to \$\$45.4 billion.
